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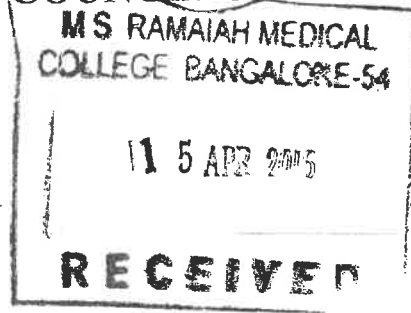

I am to state that the General Body of this council at its meeting held on 30/03/2016 considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/10/2015) along with the Council Assessor's report (June, 2014 & 18/03/2015) and compliance dated 11/05/2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at M S Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore for purpose of Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 08 to 09 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Council approved the following recommendations of the Postgraduate Committee, which I am directed to convey herewith for your information and necessary action:-

"The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/10/2015) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014 & 18/03/2015) and compliance dated 11/05/2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 08 to 09 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at M S Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

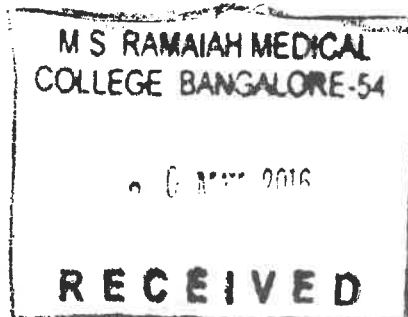

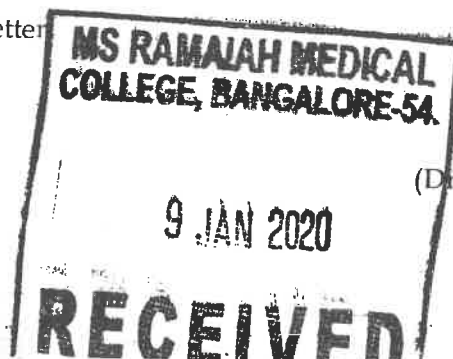
Sir/Madam,
